FROM THE CHAIR – DAN BOYSEL

Radnor Township continues to grow, and your trustees are trying to meet those requests and needs you have as residents of the Township. The newsletter gives us an opportunity to highlight projects and events occurring which impact on our daily lives. We continue to look for more opportunities and avenues to communicate the business of the township. Should you have any questions, please contact one of the trustees.

A welcome on board to newly elected trustee Donna Meyer. Donna replaces outgoing trustee Dave Weber, who we thank for his fourteen plus years of service in the Township. All will miss his experience in maintenance and road construction. Donna is a long-time resident of the township and brings experience of executive leadership at the Delaware County Historical Society and SourcePoint.

BOARD REORGANIZATION

At the first meeting in January, the Board of Trustees held their annual reorganization meeting, designed to set meeting times, elect officers, and committee representatives. The results for 2026 are:

- Chair Dan Boysel, and Vice Chair Cameron James, Trustee at Large Donna Meyer.

- Township Fire Dependency Board Representatives; Trustee James. Michael Foreman, Stanley Steed, Kip Millhoan, and Steve Bellville.

- Ohio Twp Assoc. Risk Management Representatives: Fiscal Officer Wheeland, Trustee James.

- Delaware County Regional Planning Rep: Trustee Boysel, Alternate - Brad Jolliff.

- The Trustees discussed cemetery lot fees, township resident and property owner prices increased to \$500 and nonresident lot prices remained steady at \$5,000. General openings and closings increased to the cost of \$850, Saturday, Sunday and holiday costs are \$1,700.

- Employee wages rose 3% to remain competitive with wage increases in the county and surrounding areas.

- Mileage reimbursement rate increased from \$0.70 to \$0.725 per mile, matching IRS.

- Community room rental rate is \$175 per use.

- 2026 Trustee meeting schedule is the 2nd and 4th Monday at 6:30 PM, each month, at the Radnor Township Community Hall.

TOWNSHIP COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

ELECTRIC AGGREGATION NOTIFICATION IS LEGITIMATE

If you are an Ohio Edison electric customer, you have recently received notice from Dynegy regarding the community electric aggregation program. This is a legitimate letter. In 2025, your Board of Trustees selected Dynegy as your certified electric generation supplier. This was a three-year contract, with the opportunity for community members to "opt out" annually. Your participation is voluntary and you may "opt out" at any time. Through Dynegy your electric rates have been lower than Ohio Edison's "price to compare." ASSISTANT FISCAL OFFICER HIRING

The board has recently hired Jessica Berry to the position of temporary assistant to the Fiscal Officer. Jessica will assist and provide back-up to the Fiscal Officer in all manners of Township record keeping and accounting. This also provides the township with resilience in the position should the Fiscal Officer not be available.

Jessica is a Buckeye Valley graduate from Radnor and comes to us with a background in governmental bookkeeping, payroll, and accounts payable. Welcome Jess!

ROAD CONSTRUCTION IN PROGRESS

First, thank you from the Township Trustees for your support of the road and bridge maintenance renewal levy last fall. These funds are essential to complete the scheduled road resurfacing plan and to keep up with road maintenance which comes up each year. Currently we have three culvert projects which were not in the resurfacing plan but need immediate repairs, as well as hazardous tree issues along our roadways.

The 2026 resurfacing plan includes River Road from Dildine to Radnor Road, North Section Line from Norton to the township line, Hills-Miller, Peel Road, John, Baker, Taylor, Amos, Main and Gray Streets. The estimated costs of these improvements are \$185,000.

RADNOR AREA BUCKEYE VALLEY ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Since 2013, the Radnor/Radnor Area Buckeye Valley Alumni Association has been soliciting donations from local businesses and private citizens for their Pride-In-Radnor fund raising project to enhance the attractiveness of the Village of Radnor. Projects funded by the Association include eleven historical markers, headstone repair in both cemeteries, flowers for the Radnor Museum and the entrance to the cemetery.

PARK UPDATE

Park improvements continue to take place and will be completed by the beginning of summer. The park entrance combined from two entrances into a single entrance, improving safety from the SR 203 traffic. Other additions you will see include added stone parking lots, and a great walking trail. Trustees secured a grant from the ODNR in 2024 for \$160,000, in addition to local donations of stone by National Stone and Lime as well as donations from other local businesses and ball teams.

Thanks go to the trustee team Dan Boysel for writing the grant, Cameron James for overseeing construction and 2025 grant management, and Donna Meyer for taking the lead in 2026 bringing the project to conclusion. Thanks also to Plan4Land (Joe Clase) for providing consulting services and Senator Andrew Brenner's office for supporting the grant.

TRUSTEES LOOK AT FIRE DEPARTMENT OPTIONS

The Board continues to look at options to improve our fire and safety services as the last most recent fire levy comes up for renewal in November. We continue to look at balancing the need for extended coverage, the costs associated with additional personnel hours and the increased property tax burden for our residents.
