REPORT FROM THE CHAIR - DAN BOYSEL

Welcome to 2022! Trustee Weber and I are beginning new 4- year terms with Trustee Watkins and Fiscal Officer Wheeland. Thank you for your support and again it is a pleasure to serve you, the residents of Radnor Township. Our focus this year continues to be upgrading the 28 miles of roads which are the township's responsibility. The targeted roads this year include Buttermilk Hill, Gallant, Penry, and Roberts Road, which is about 4 miles of road. Updating tractors and machinery continue to be a priority for the township.

Additionally the board will be reviewing and updating personnel and office policies as well as job descriptions for the township.

TOWNSHIP REORGANIZATION UPDATE

At the 1st meeting in January, the Board of Trustees held their annual reorganization meeting, designed to set meeting times, elect officers, and committee representatives. The results for 2022 are:

Chair- Dan Boysel, Vice Chair Teresa Watkins, and Trustee at large David Weber.

Township Fire Dependency Board Representatives; Trustee Watkins, Stanley Steed, Asst. Fire Chief Bob Fish

Ohio Twp Assoc. Risk Management Representatives: Fiscal Officer Wheeland, Trustee Watkins

Delaware County Regional Planning Rep: Trustee Boysel, Alternate-Dan Huffman

The Trustees discussed cemetery lot fees, township resident and property owner prices were raised from \$250 to \$300 and nonresident lot prices from \$1,800 to \$2,000. General openings and closings remain the same cost of \$655.

Employee and firefighter wages were raised 3% to remain competitive with the wage increases in the county and surrounding areas.

2022 Trustee meetings are scheduled for the 4th Monday of each month, 7:00 p.m. being held at the Radnor Township Community Hall.

RADNOR FIRE DEPARTMENT YEAR END CALL/RUN REPORT

Radnor Township Fire Department once again had a challenging 2021 due to the ongoing COVID Pandemic. Although challenging, 2021 was still an exciting and successful year. There were 109 call outs in 2021 which is average for the past five years. With the addition of staffing on station, response times have been reduced and efficiency to 911 calls have been increased. Station staffing was started in 2015 and occurs Monday through Friday 7:30 am to 4:30 pm. Listed below are some 2021 facts.

Daytime staffing has decreased response time from the time of call until personnel were responding to the scene from 60-10 minutes down to 2 minutes.

Volunteer Staffing – covers the times and days when there is no staffing at the station in addition to when station staffing is available. The average response time from the time of call until personnel are responding to a 911 call is from 5-8 minutes.

109 call outs are broken down into 4 groups (41 were responded to by station staffing during 7:30-4:30 M-F)

- 37 - Fire
- 42 - EMS (First Responder)
- 18 - Service Call
- 12 - Auto Accident

Radnor TFD provided 16 assistance runs to the surrounding 6 mutual aid departments as well as providing a total of 15 runs as contracted emergency services to Thompson Township, Delaware County.

PARK COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Trustees voted to have a land survey of the park property completed to accurately demark the property boundaries. A survey was not completed when Buckeye Valley Schools donated the park to the township.

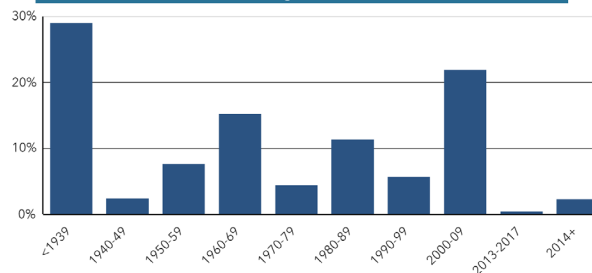
